Introduction & Itinerary

Norway's appeal is remarkably simple: It is one of the most beautiful countries on Earth. This cruise, offered year-round, has duly earned its place as an iconic travel route. Our dedicated crew and Expedition Team enhances your voyage, fully immersing you in the stunning landscapes we sail through, and providing you with unique opportunities to taste and explore the Norwegian coast. Visit cities such as Bergen, Ålesund, and Trondheim before crossing the Arctic Circle; southbound, you see incredible Lofoten and Trollfjorden, and pass the Seven Sisters mountain range. In the spring months, the coastline teems with new life; in the summer, enjoy the almost 24-hour daylight and glorious midnight sun. Vivid colours greet you in autumn, while in winter, explore pristine landscapes under the mesmerizing aurora borealis.

DAY 1 - BERGEN

Your voyage starts in Bergen; the Gateway to the Fjords. Discover this charming and compact city before embarkation.

DAY 2 - FLORØ / MOLDE

Sail past the West Cape to reach Ålesund. A Day for Architectural and Natural Masterpieces. Optional tour to visit Atlanterhavsparken – one of Northern Europe's largest saltwater aquariums.

DAY 3 - KRISTIANSUND / RØRVIK

Join our optional excursion to explore Norway's third largest city, Trondheim. Discover Medieval Spirit in the Old Capital. Then the ship heads toward charming Rørvik in the afternoon.

DAY 4 - BRØNNØYSUND / SVOLVÆR

Prepare for a day of excitement! The ship proceeds to Tromsø, the capital of the Arctic. Join our Polar History Walk excursion in winter to be feeling like a polar hero; or a kayaking excursion in summer to discover more of Tromsø's surroundings.



DAY 6 - ØKSFJORD / BERLEVÅG

Enjoy magnificent sub-Arctic landscapes as we cross the 71st parallel on our journey toward the North Cape, one of the northernmost points on the European continent.

DAY 7 - BÅTSFJORD / KIRKENES / BERLEVÅG

Arrival in Kirkenes - take part in numerous adventurous activities in the Arctic environment. Varieties of activities and excursions available all year round. Learn about the history, climate and wildlife.

DAY 8 - MEHAMN / TROMSØ

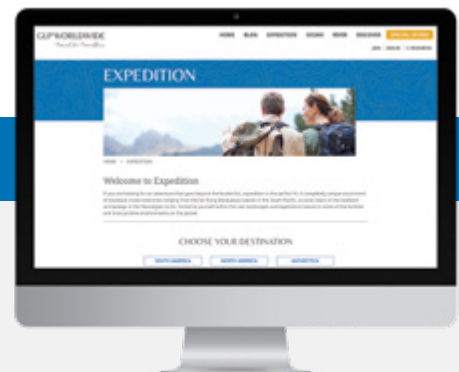

North Pole

13 DAYS / 12 NIGHTS | FROM \$38,469

Voyage in the footsteps of Arctic explorers in this unique adventure, as our nuclear-powered icebreaker unlocks for you the majestic wonders of the North Pole.

Introduction & Itinerary

This Arctic expedition is a once-in-a-lifetime experience that will take you through the ice of the Barents Sea, put you at the geographic North Pole, and immerse you in the incredible geography, wildlife, and history of the famed Franz Josef Land archipelago. Take in the stunning Arctic from all angles: from sea, from shore, and even from sky through our helicopter sightseeing excursions. Observe wildlife like polar bears and colonies of sea birds, walk through history at various memorials to Arctic explorers, and gain valuable insight into this remarkable area from our expert staff and guest lecturers.

DAY 1 - MURMANSK, RUSSIA

Welcome to the city of Murmansk on Russia's Kola Peninsula, starting point of our adventure. Upon your arrival at the airport we provide a transfer to your hotel, which has been arranged by us and is included in the price of the voyage.

DAY 2 - EMBARKATION IN MURMANSK

Today we board the nuclear-powered icebreaker 50 Let Pobedy. Explore the ship and get orientated as we slip our moorings and sail north out of Kola Bay.

DAY 3-6 - THE VOYAGE NORTH

Nowhere can it be more truly said that "getting there is half the fun". As we cruise northward through the Barents Sea there is always the possibility of seeing whales. Meanwhile, you have the opportunity to learn about the unique icebreaking capabilities of the ship.

As we make our way across the ice cap, you witness firsthand the ship's awesome power as massive ice blocks give way under the enormous bulk of the spoon-shaped bow. The sensation of being on deck at this time is surreal and unforgettable.

We also take advantage of 24-hour daylight to offer helicopter flightseeing tours. From the air you can observe the ship crushing a path through the ice. You also have a unique vantage point from which to witness the stunning beauty of this vast polar icescape.

DAY 7 - NORTH POLE

Welcome to the geographic North Pole! After carefully navigating to 90 degrees North, we ceremoniously drop the anchor on a sturdy stretch of ice and disembark onto the frozen sea. Now is the time to experiencing the long-anticipated thrill of standing at the top of the world. Join hands with your fellow passengers and literally walk around the world during our special International Round



Dance. You are also treated to a barbecue meal on the ice. You may even have the chance to take a plunge into the icy water!

DAY 8-10 - EXPLORATION OF FRANZ JOSEF LAND

The Franz Josef Land archipelago, part of the Russian Arctic National Park since 2012, is a nature sanctuary.

Polar bears and other quintessential High Arctic wildlife—such as walrus and some rare whale species—can be spotted anytime, anywhere in and around Franz Josef Land. Scree slopes and cliffs around the islands host enormous nesting colonies of migratory seabirds such as guillemots, dovekies, and ivory gulls. We take advantage of 24-hour daylight to exploit every opportunity for wildlife viewing and excursions via Zodiac and helicopter.

Franz Josef Land is home to some interesting geological features, such as the mysterious stone spheres on Champ Island. Collectors of geographical extremes may take note that Cape Fligely on Rudolf Island is the northernmost point of land in the Eastern Hemisphere.

Franz Josef Land also offers visitors the opportunity to walk in the footsteps of famous polar explorers at well-preserved historical sites. The journals of explorers come alive at Cape Norway, Cape Flora, Eira Harbour, and Cape Tegetthoff. Memorials, monuments, crosses, and the remains of dwellings are testimony to incredible historical events that are further illuminated by our expert lecturers.

Tikhaya Bukhta is currently a Russian Arctic National Park ranger station occupying Soviet-era research buildings and was also a major base for polar expeditions. Nearby, the fascinating columnar basalt cliffs of Rubini Rock are home to thousands of nesting seabirds.

DAY 11-12 - THE VOYAGE SOUTH

After our amazing time in Franz Josef Land we cross back south through the bountiful waters of the Barents Sea. Presentations and workshops by our expert staff ensure that these days at sea are not idly spent. You may also take advantage of onboard facilities and amenities such as a polar library, volleyball court, gym, two saunas, warm seawater pool, gift shop, and massage treatments. Seabird viewing and whale sightings can be enjoyed from panoramic open decks as well as exterior stateroom windows.

DAY 13 - DISEMBARKATION IN MURMANSK

Our once-in-a-lifetime journey comes to an end. After breakfast we say farewell in Murmansk. We provide you with a transfer to the airport for your flight home.

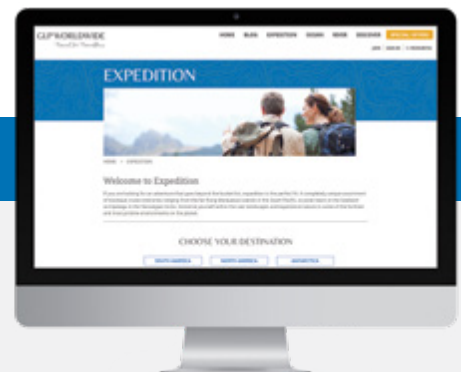

ARCTIC

Northwest Passage – In The Wake Of Great Explorers

14 DAYS / 13 NIGHTS | FROM \$22,150

Sail in the wake of the early explorers from Kangerlussuaq in Greenland to Cambridge Bay in Canada. Experience the raw and daunting beauty of the terrain that some of history's greatest explorers had to overcome. Even today, few ships have the capability to navigate this sea passage that cuts through the remote Arctic regions of North America.

Introduction & Itinerary

Since the late 15th century, the search for this fabled route through the Canadian Arctic was a holy grail for explorers. The most famous journey here was James Cook's failed attempt to sail the Passage in 1776, and of course the ill-fated Franklin expedition of 1834. The first to conquer the Northwest Passage by ship was Norwegian explorer Roald Amundsen between 1903 to 1906. Starting in Kangerlussuaq, you have a chance to see some of the Greenlandic Inuit settlements and the UNESCO World Heritage site Ilulissat Icefjord, before we cross the Davis Strait and venture into the Canadian Arctic Archipelago of Nunavut, starting our expedition into the heart and history of the Northwest Passage. We make our way through the icy waters of Arctic Canada, or Nunavut where we will call at some of the world's northernmost communities, explore legendary inlets and channels, and take you on exciting small boat cruising and landings.

DAY 1 - COPENHAGEN, DENMARK / KANGERLUSSUAQ, GREENLAND

Fly from charming Copenhagen to Kangerlussuaq to board MS Fram and begin your epic journey by sailing the impressive 118-mile fjord to the open sea.

DAY 2 - SISIMIUT

Look for humpback, fin, and minke whales, as well as seals and porpoises, as we head toward this settlement 25 miles north of the Arctic Circle.

DAY 3 - ILULISSAT

The stunning Ilulissat Icefjord, a UNESCO site, features the Jakobshavn Glacier, one of the most productive ice masses in the Northern Hemisphere. Hear the cracking and rumbling of the ice on a small-boat cruise, or admire the icefjord from above on a helicopter tour.

DAYS 4 - 5 - AT SEA

Enjoy fascinating lectures as we sail Davis Strait.

DAY 6 - POND INLET, BAFFIN ISLAND

Surrounded by mountains, glaciers, fjords, and ice caves, we look for fantastic wildlife such as polar bears and pods of narwhal before enjoying a cultural performance.



DAY 7 - LANCASTER SOUND / DEVON ISLAND

We go ashore at Dundas Harbour to explore an ancient Thule site. Keep an eye out for walrus and beluga whales.

DAY 8 - BEECHEY ISLAND / RADSTOCK BAY

Striking Caswell Tower provides great hiking opportunities, and on Beechey Island, we explore the history and remains of the mysterious Franklin Expedition.

DAY 9 - THE BELLOT STRAIT

We sail through the icy waters of the Bellot Strait before emerging at Fort Ross, a tiny trading post established by the Hudson Bay Company.

DAY 10 - AT SEA

We launch our small boats to explore Coningham Bay, a hot spot for beluga whales and polar bears.

DAY 11 - AT SEA

MS Fram navigates the 112-mile-long, 40-mile-wide James Ross Strait, in the wake of Roald Amundsen's Gjøa Expedition.

DAY 12 - GJØA HAVEN

Amundsen and his men spent two years at this harbor, later named in their honor. Today, the town is known for its vibrant arts scene, with beautiful traditional carvings and needlework. Visit the heritage center and watch the skies for loons, geese, terns, snow buntings, and snowy owls.

DAY 13 - CAMBRIDGE BAY / VICTORIA ISLAND

This hamlet on the Ekalluk River is rich with evidence of the indigenous people who have been living in this area for 4,000 years. Wildlife abounds in Victoria Island, with caribou, musk oxen, and seals often making an appearance. You will be transferred for a flight to Edmonton and then to a hotel for an overnight stay.

DAY 14 - EDMONTON, CANADA

Today, return home or continue with your onward journey.

The original Fram was the most famous explorer ship of its time, and the achievements of her expeditions are unparalleled. MS Fram honors the heritage of the original Fram, using the most advanced technology and making her exceptionally well suited for expedition voyages in polar regions.

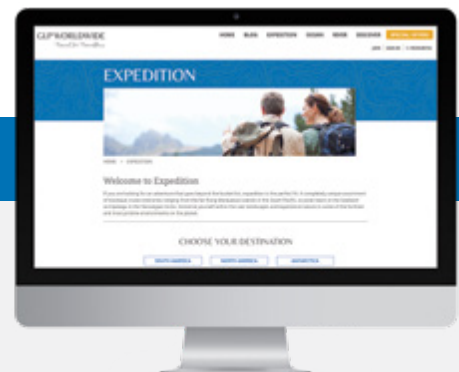

Introduction & Itinerary

On this 12-day expedition cruise, we immerse you in the full Icelandic experience: unspoiled nature, incredible geological activity, ancient history, and friendly communities. At sea, watch for birds and whales as you take in the entirety of Iceland's breathtaking coast. On land, Iceland's unique position on the Mid-Atlantic Ridge has created active volcanoes and geysers, lava fields, and numerous hot springs for you to discover. In the midst of fjords, mountains, and powerful waterfalls are colourful fishing villages, seaside towns, and vibrant cities. These modern communities keep their ancient heritage and mystic lore of trolls and elves very much alive. DAY 3 - BÍLDUDALUR

We sail the scenic Westfjords. Discover the Látrabjarg cliffs, home to millions of birds, such as puffins, northern gannets, guillemots, and razorbills.

DAY 4 - ÍSAFJÖRÐUR

Some of the oldest dwellings in Iceland are found here, along with the Maritime Museum. Join an excursion in the footsteps of trolls or a horseback-riding outing.

DAY 5: HORNBJARG CLIFF / REYKJAFJÖRÐUR

We land our small boats at one of the largest seabird habitats in Iceland as we explore this stunning area.

DAY 6 - HRÍSEY / AKUREYRI

40 species of birds nest in this area set amid towering mountains. Join an excursion to an impressive waterfall or natural hot springs.

DAY 7 - GRIMSEY

The Arctic Circle cuts across this green and grassy island.



DAY 8 - HÚSAVÍK

Enjoy one of the best whale-watching locations in the world, with perfect conditions for baleen whales.

DAY 9 - BAKKAGERÐI / SEYÐISFJÖRÐUR

The 'Land of the Elves' is known for its natural beauty boasts puffin colonies and deep Nordic heritage in these lovely and remote settlements.

DAY 10 - DJÚPIVOGUR

This stunningly diverse area offers glaciers – Vatnajökull Glacier is the largest in Europe, and a spectacular sight – with bird sanctuaries and great hiking opportunities.

DAY 11 - VESTMANNAEYJAR, HEIMAey

Magnificent cliffs, puffins and kittiwakes, whale-watching, and active volcanoes make this island an unforgettable stop.

DAY 12 - REYKJAVÍK

Our adventure ends here. If you have time, join us on one of our Land Adventures to discover more treasures of Iceland, such as the Blue Lagoon, before your journey home.
